## BULK TRASH

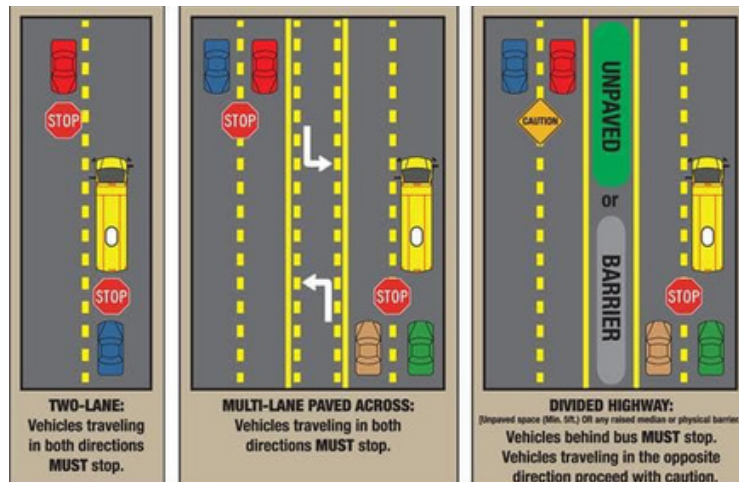
Bulk trash will be in April.

NORTH of Hwy 37 April 11th-15th  
SOUTH of Hwy 37 April 18th-22nd

Tuttle's next bulk trash pick up will be in April. All bulk trash must be at the curb no later than 6:00 AM Monday morning of your designated week. It will take Republic Services the entire week to pick up all bulk waste.

There is a limit of 3 cubic yards per household, for reference a standard oven is 1 cubic yard. The bulk waste pick up program only applies to City of Tuttle trash customers. ## FROM THE FIRE CHIEF

Fire Safety is an important part of barn life. Here are some important safety tips to consider keeping the barn and livestock safe.

- Heat lamps and space heaters are kept a safe distance (at least 3 feet) from anything that can burn
- Heaters are kept on a sturdy surface that cannot fall over
- Extension cords are not used in the barn, they are easy to damage and become a fire hazard
- Feed, hay, straw, and flammable liquids are stored away from the main barn
- Fire extinguishers are kept in easy to reach places and people are trained to use them
- A hazard checklist is created and completed on a set schedule (checking for things such as damage, cobwebs, trash, or other hazardous conditions)
