### BURN BAN INFORMATION

The Grady County Commissioners issued a burn ban in the early part of January that has been extended and looks like it will continue until the area sees some significant precipitation. While many homeowners are very diligent and cautious when conducting burns, with the weather conditions even an observed fire can get out of control quickly. The soil moisture is really low causing surface fuels to ignite quickly. Even when a little precipitation has fallen, the ground will still remain really dry and the heat from a fire will quickly dry up any moisture causing fire spread. The wind speeds are also not helping as any fire may send hot ash up into the air and allow it to catch an area on fire that is not near the original location. For these reasons the burn ban has been put into place to help prevent wildfires. It is also important to remember that while grilling is allowed, it needs to be conducted over a non-flammable surface and at least 5 feet from flammable vegetation so that radiant heat from the grill does not cause an unintended fire. Should you see a fire in this time make sure to contact the local dispatch center to report it so it can be investigated, possibly preventing a small fire from turning into a large one.
